Geotechnical work at Interbay Golf Center

What

Sound Transit plans to do geotechnical borings for soil analysis on the west edge of the Interbay Golf Course. This work is necessary to plan and design possible light rail alignments to be studied in the environmental review process (see reverse side for project map).

When

- Work is expected to begin as early as **Monday, Feb. 2 and is scheduled to be completed by Friday, Feb. 27**. Work hours are from **2 to 11 p.m. on weekdays**.
- Dates and times may change due to weather or other issues.

Where

- Crews will work at four locations on the west edge of the Interbay Golf Course. They will move south to north as each drilling site is completed.
- Drilling equipment will remain on site. Crews will park work trucks and other equipment on the east edge of the golf course and store some materials in the north parking lot.

What to expect

- Drilling equipment will sound like a truck engine running, with occasional hammering.
- The driving range and restaurant will be open during normal hours. Course play will end at 2 p.m. on weekdays, with normal weekend hours.
- For your safety, please stay out of work areas.

More

- To study soil conditions and groundwater elevation, a drill rig is used to bore into the ground and collect soil samples.
- Crews will install devices to monitor water levels on future visits. Water level readings do not generate noise.
- In accordance with all local regulations, borings will be installed carefully to avoid soil erosion and prevent dirt or mud from leaking into surface waters, wetlands, and drainage systems.
