KID has agreed to service the Canyon Lakes irrigation system that previously was the Canyon Lakes Water Company. This includes all homeowners that live North or below the canal, and a few that live above or South of the canal.

You will need to contact them for any issues regarding lines, pressure or emergency shut off. They have been fantastic to work with from our end and will be a better fit going forward for all homeowners.

When they have completed

revamping the system to have water from their pump, it will also help to create better pressure and even cleaner water.

Please use patience as they learn their new role and complete the takeover of the system by fall.

## Golf Now — Our New Online Provider for Tee Times

Our online tee times are now available to be booked through Golf Now. This has several advantages for both the customer and the players using the website. It asks for a credit card for everyone. Members will not be charged for any times made unless they become a no-show issue. All other players will be charged through the website to make it easier as you check in.

This new system allows players to book all their times online. Members must sign up through the portal on the main page of the website. You have to have registered when you signed up with an email address, so when you attempt to log in on the new members portal it will identify you as a member so you are not paying green fees when you sign up.

## From the Maintenance Crew at Canyon Lakes Golf Course

### **Please stay on all cart paths where they are provided.**

Please keep all four tires on the cart path. Please make sure to replace divots or sand them. Also please help with ball marks as much as possible. To ensure the best results it is important to keep golf carts away from approach areas to greens. For those that have Blue flagged carts, no cart should ever

go between a green and a bunker, or between the green and lake on number 9. This will be strictly enforced and understand we need to be consistent with everyone. It might be a few more feet away, but laziness really causes a lot of damage. If everyone does their part, we will see a difference.

With most groups going out

with member play in four carts it creates a lot of wear on turf during a time it is not growing. The Golf Shop will be talking to those that violate cart usage rules. If you have questions, please see Matt Mandell in the Golf Shop. As for the canal work, They finished the work on holes 14—16. The last stretch from five tee to six tee will be done when the KID can finish it. We

are hoping that will happen next winter. KID will let us know when they plan on returning to finish the lining for the canal.
