Investing in East Lake: Q&A with Madelyn R. Adams, New Executive Director

In August, the East Lake Foundation welcomed its new Executive Director, Madelyn R. Adams. Madelyn has been an active voice in Atlanta's non-profit community for several years, and serves on the boards of Woodward Academy, The Alliance Theatre, the Hughes Spalding Children's Hospital operating committee, and Imagine It! The Children's Museum of Atlanta. She moved to Atlanta in 1991 to work for the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games, and joined the Atlanta Journal Constitution in 1996, managing the newspaper's community outreach, among other responsibilities. Madelyn and her two sons reside in Atlanta and are huge sports fans.

How did you become interested in working with the East Lake Foundation?

In many ways the Foundation's revitalization efforts mirror my work with the Olympic Games. Both are based on the notion that sport can lead to the development of a safer, more prosperous society. Core to the Olympic movement is the belief that sport can be used to help bridge cultural and ethnic divides, create jobs, promote tolerance and education, as well as encourage healthy lifestyles. East Lake is a wonderful microcosm of this Olympic ideal, where golf is used as a catalyst to promote a more healthy, whole and sustainable community overall. I wanted to use my business experience to give back to the community, and East Lake's innovative approach to community redevelopment was a wonderful marriage of previous experience and opportunity for me.

What have you learned about East Lake since joining the Foundation?

Beyond the complexity and scope of East Lake, I think I have been most impressed with the wealth of human capital vested in its success. It has been a whirlwind process of getting to know the people who work in East Lake (with a TOUR Championship thrown in too!), as well as the many outside organizations we partner with to achieve our goals. From the people who staff



our immediate partners within the East Lake community – The Villages of East Lake, Drew Charter School and Sheltering Arms, the Charlie Yates Golf Course and the East Lake Family YMCA – to the many experts who enhance our programming, and even the amazing volunteers who dedicate their time here in East Lake, it has been a wonderfully eye-opening experience.

There are a lot of very worthy organizations in Atlanta. What sets the East Lake Foundation apart from the others?

Many of the reasons that attracted me to work in East Lake are the same reasons for supporting this community. East Lake represents an innovative approach of committed partners that works. Everyday we can see the benefit that funding programs in East Lake achieves. With the academic assistance and extracurricular programming being offered at Drew, 84 % of students now meet or exceed state standards. East Lake families who, with the help of financial counseling offered through The Villages of East Lake's resident services, are able to achieve the dream of home ownership. I am also particularly impressed that the East Lake model ensures 100% of a donation received is used to fund those programs that work to make East Lake a success. It has been a privilege to become a part of this organization, and I look forward to the returns my support will make.

Aloha! Drew Students experience Hawaiian culture first hand...



Drew Charter School's 8th grade Junior Beta Club traveled to Hawaii in May on a seven-day cultural exchange with fellow 8th graders at Dole Academy in Oahu. The trip was the culmination of a year-long exchange between the two schools, designed to engage and reward Drew's highest performing students, illustrate the effective use of technology as a means of communication and learning, and experience Hawaiian culture. Drew students blogged with their Hawaiian counterparts about their respective cities, studied Hawaiian culture, history and ecology and created videos, journal entries and photo albums online about life in Atlanta.

Selected trips to Hawaiian landmarks like the Polynesian Cultural Center (pictured), the Pearl Harbor Memorial Museum, and Diamond Head volcanic crater, provided Drew students with opportunities to experience and apply what they learned online. The students held fundraisers throughout the year to help fund the trip.

"The opportunity to converse with Hawaiian students, and travel across America to meet our western neighbors was once in a lifetime, and fulfilling for all of us," wrote one Drew participant. This year, Drew's Junior Beta Club is fostering an online exchange with fellow 8th graders in San Francisco, and hope to travel to meet their "pen pals" this spring

families met weekly with Fit Kids nutritionists to learn about nutrition, the importance of an active lifestyle and the role self-esteem plays in healthy habits. Participating families were challenged to increase their consumption of fruits and vegetables, track their weekly activities, reduce the amount time spent on computers, video games and watching TV, and reduce their intake of sweetened beverages. Since 1996, the Fit Kids program has successfully increased awareness among at-risk families, highlighting the importance the entire family plays in encouraging healthy habits in children. "It has taught my entire family how to eat healthier," noted one participating Drew parent, "and we have bonded and had fun together at being fit."

East Lake Family YMCA honors Eva Davis


