The 88 high school graduates participate in CREW Teens, an after school academic support program of the East Lake Foundation. Four years ago, they were the first class of students to complete 8th grade at East Lake's Charles R. Drew Charter School. Proud parents, families, friends and supporters gathered in celebration on May 31. Photographers captured the diverse sea of caps and gowns, representing 14 different high schools.
