Summer's here! Wow did it get hot fast! I can't stress to everyone the importance of taking care of yourselves before, during and after your rounds. Heat exhaustion & stroke can sneak up on us all if we do not properly prepare ourselves for the heat. I have played in a few events these last two weeks and I've really had to rethink just how prepared I am for the heat and exposure to the sun. Make sure you always wear headwear. A wide brimmed hat works best. Clothing manufacturers are creating lightweight long sleeved shirts as well as SPF 50 shirts. The golf shop has sun sleeves that cover your arms without adding extra heat. Sunscreen should be applied to

all exposed skin areas. Also, please try to play golf in sunglasses. I haven't played or practiced without eye protection in years! Your eyes are one of your most vital organs. They need to be protected on the golf course & practice range. I would be glad to loan any of my glasses for a demonstration. Feel to stop by my office anytime.

By the time this edition goes to press, the green on Ibis 1 will have been re-sprigged. The decision was made to re-sprig instead of sod to provide a better playing surface later this summer. We will be using a temporary green on Ibis 1 in the meantime. The good champion turn that was present on Ibis 1 has been transplanted on Ibis 8 & Heron 1. The nursery green will also be re-sprigged when Ibis 1 is sprigged. Once the sprigs have taken on the nursery green, we can transplant that turn to any of the remain blemishes on the greens. This process will take 7 or 8 weeks to complete. This will allow Tom and his staff time to push the weak areas heading into the next aerification at the end of July.

Congratulations to Mr. & Mrs. Allen on winning the 2018 Husband & Wife Championship. As the competitors were preparing to play that morning, I was walking along the range tee and asked a few members "When was the last time they played golf with their spouse?" The answers really didn't surprise me because I see the amount of rounds played individually. What can the Club do to promote more play as couples? Why don't you play golf with your spouse? GOLF TIP OF THE MONTH



PUTT FOR DOUGH!!

Drive for show, Putt for dough! The key skill this month is PUTTING! With the greens coming back to quicker speeds, the temperatures rising, and conditions toughening up on the course we are all going to need to save some strokes at some point during the round. The best place to save these strokes is on the green with the flat stick. Two tips this month that are going to help each of you improve your putting, and proximity to the hole involve your grip pressure, and your swing path with the putter.

One of the most important rules of thumb in putting is don't strangle the putter! By this we mean your grip pressure should be light and you should be able to feel the putter head during every motion of the putting stroke. If we are gripping the putter too tight, our distance control goes out the window and we are unable to keep a consistent roll on the ball that allows us to keep our lag putts within a foot or two. The saying "golf is a game of misses" is highly exaggerated when it comes to putting, and the further our ball is away from the hole, the less of a chance there is to hole that putt.

When it comes to the path of the putter during the stroke, the key is to keep your club face square at impact, returning the club to its original position, and following through once contact is made. One of the best drills that we have found to ensure a proper putting stroke is to put your putter head on the green, then put in 2 golf tees into the ground – 1 tee slightly in front of the toe of the putter, and 1 tee just before the heel of the putter (as shown in the photo). If your swing path is not correct your putter head will bounce off of the tees in the ground. You will hit the tee at the toe of the putter if your follow through is outside of your path, pushing the ball out right if you made contact. Just the opposite happens when you bounce the putter head off of the tee positioned at the heel – the ball would start out left with the putting stroke to the inside which is considered a "pull" in your putting stroke. Using these two tips of grip pressure and the correct putter head path, will ensure and enhance your proximity to the hole, and your overall contact with the golf ball.
