

Local Team leads 3 out of 5 championships

DAY 1 - Dorado, PR - Host team Puerto Rico began its participation at the 58th Caribbean Amateur Golf Championships presented by the Puerto Rico Tourism Company with the right foot, as three out of the five teams participating were able to lead their respective categories.

The Hoerman Cup team composed by Robert Calvesbert, Jeronimo Esteve III, Edward Figueroa, Erick Morales and rookie Chris Nido, dominated the field during the first round as they finished with aggregate score of 293 strokes (+5). Figueroa was the best player on 5-men team as he signed his scorecard at 1-under par (71), while Erick Morales (+1) Esteve III (+2) and Calvesbert (+3) were the three additional scores which counted towards the team total, who leads over the Dominican Republic and Trinidad &Tobago who are in 2nd & 3rd place respectively.

The Senior & Super Senior teams also finished atop the leaderboard of their respective categories which helped Puerto Rico earned additional points towards the team total considered for the Arthur Ziadie Overall trophy.

Playing at the Sugarcane course, Felipe Colon and Mario Carbia (72) lead the field at the Senior Division field by two strokes ahead of Dominican Republic and Trinidad & Tobago which are tied for 2nd place with 74 strokes. At the Super Seniors, a 2-under par score of 70 strokes gave Carlos Matos and Alberto Carrero the lead on their category by the minimum difference of one stroke from a triple tie between the USVI, Bahamas and Jamaica teams.

Junior Team wins 7th CAJGC Title



Dorado, PR - The **27th edition of the Caribbean Amateur Junior Golf Championships presented by the Puerto Rico Tourism Company** came to an end on Thursday at 18th hole of the Sugarcane Course, were host Team PUR once again emerged as the Best Team Overall of the regional junior golf championships. Counting with this year's win, Puerto Rico has become a strong and dominant team among the countries that actively participate from the event. **Conducted by the Caribbean Golf Association and hosted by the PRGA at Dorado Beach Resort & Golf Club, the 54-hole event showcased the participation of a total of eight teams. PUERTO RICO** earned the 1st place as Best Team Overall with a total of 161 points. Out of their team total, 55 points were added today when a total of four (4) out of the six (6) categories earned 10 points.

In second place finished the **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC** with a 136 points and a strong finish by two of the players at the Boys 17&U. The team from **TRINIDAD&TOBAGO** came in 3rd place with 121 points, followed by **BAHAMAS** (92), **JAMAICA** (69) and the **USVI** (61). The teams of **BARBADOS** and the **CAYMAN ISLANDS** were not able to field full teams, yet they allow a delegation of juvenile golfers to proudly represent their respective countries. Other special prizes were also awarded to individual golfers who earned invitations to the Duke of York – Young Champions Trophy.

Morales who is one of the rookies in the team was able to finish a top the leaderboard for the Boys 11-13 at 2-under par.

Kristina Ortiz once again lead the field at the Girls Division in the 17&U age group, while Diana Velez repeated as the best score of the 15&U field to accumulate 10 points each in favor of the

Puerto Rico continues to be the leading country at the Hank James trophy with a total of 106 points, while the Dominican Republic remains in second place with 92 points while Trinidad & Tobago is in third with 81 points.

PUR takes early lead at CAJGC

Dorado, PR - Led by a 3 under par score of 69 stokes recorded by Ian Aldarondo at the Boys 15&U, and two other first places by Kristina Ortiz (Girls 17&U) & Diana Velez (Girls 15&U), that added up a total points of 30 towards the Hank James trophy overall competition, Team PUR was able to take an early lead with 53 points after Round 1 at the 27th CAJGC conducted by the CGA and organized by the Puerto Rico at Dorado Beach Sugarcane Course.

Aldarondo, was the lowest score on the entire field of juvenile players where two other competitors finished with rounds under par. Rodrigo Sanchez (-2) and Juan Jose Guerra (-1), both from the Dominican Republic signed their cards with scores below the par of the course (72) and posted red numbers in favor of their country which is in second place with 46 points followed by Trinidad & Tobago on third with 42 points.
