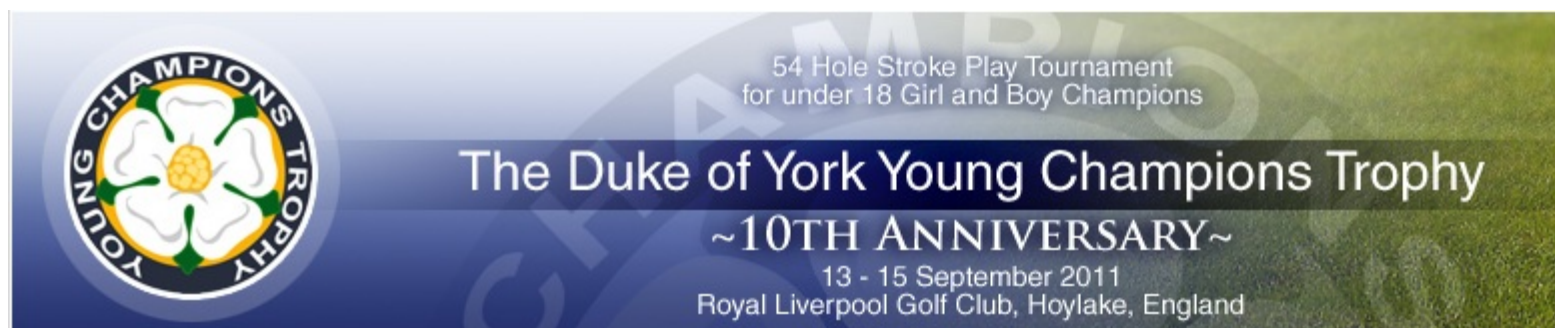


# Robles represented PR at the DOY's Champions Trophy

**Hoylake, England** (September 15, 2011) - First played in 2001, [Duke Of York Young Champions Trophy](#) is a unique, international 54 hole stroke play golf tournament for boys and girls who are either the current holders of their Under 18 National Championship or have won some other major golfing event in the preceding year.

Paola Robles from Aguadilla, Puerto Rico had the opportunity to participate this year as she received a special invitation by winning the 2011 Caribbean Amateur Junior Golf Championships played in Barbados this past July. Despite very hard playing conditions Paola managed to finish tied in 36<sup>th</sup> place with a 54 hole final score of 245 (88-81-76).

This highly rated invitational event, created by HRH The Duke of York and John Simpson, aims to promote the development of junior golf, encourage competitiveness and friendship between individual champions whilst providing them with an opportunity to play on Open venue courses against their peers.

Since the inaugural tournament in 2001 for 12 players from 6 countries, the competition has expanded geographically and now draws players from across Europe, North, South and Latin America, Asia and South Africa. Indeed the 2011 event at the [Royal Liverpool Golf Club](#) - Hoylake Course saw 55 players from 32 countries with handicaps averaging an impressive +1.5.
