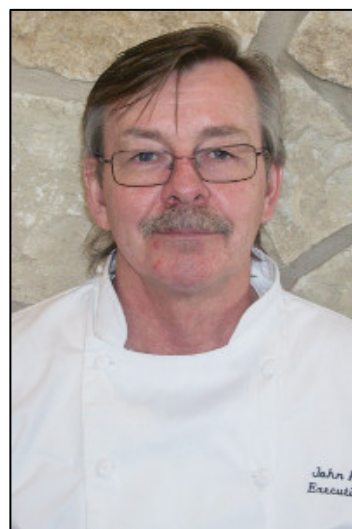

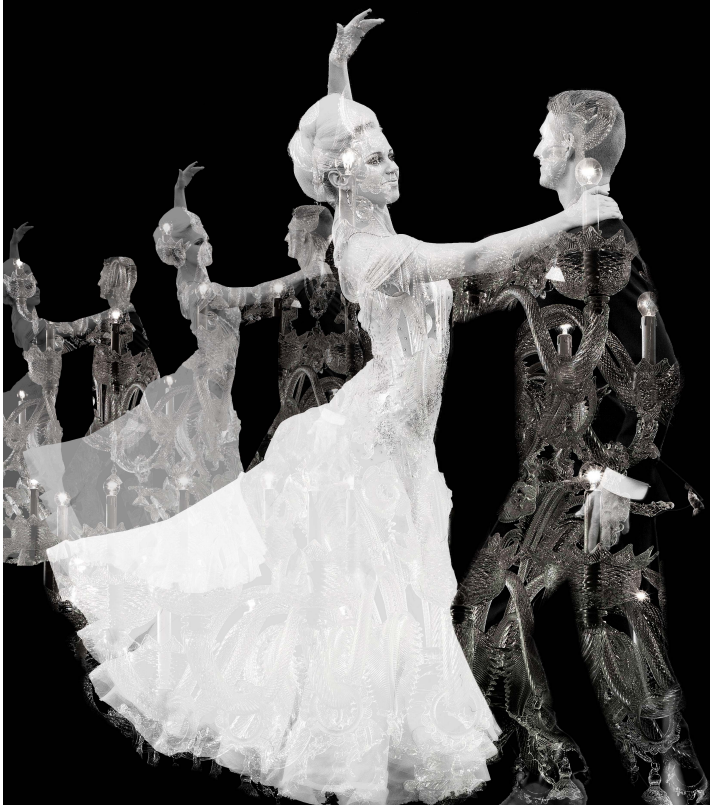

With that said, the early spring weather has become drier than we hoped for. We are hoping for more timely rainfalls to help keep our water cost down. Our irrigation is now up and running for the upcoming golfing season. We have only had minor issues with spring start up and we are currently working on resolving these.

The month of April is when we start our pre-emergent program, along with our broadleaf program. We will also be Aerifying the course; this helps with compaction and air throughout the soil. These culture practices help give us a good start for the upcoming growing season. Our crew is growing in size with some returning employees and a few new ones. We are looking forward to the upcoming season and with the warmer weather upon us we are hoping to see more and more players out on the course.

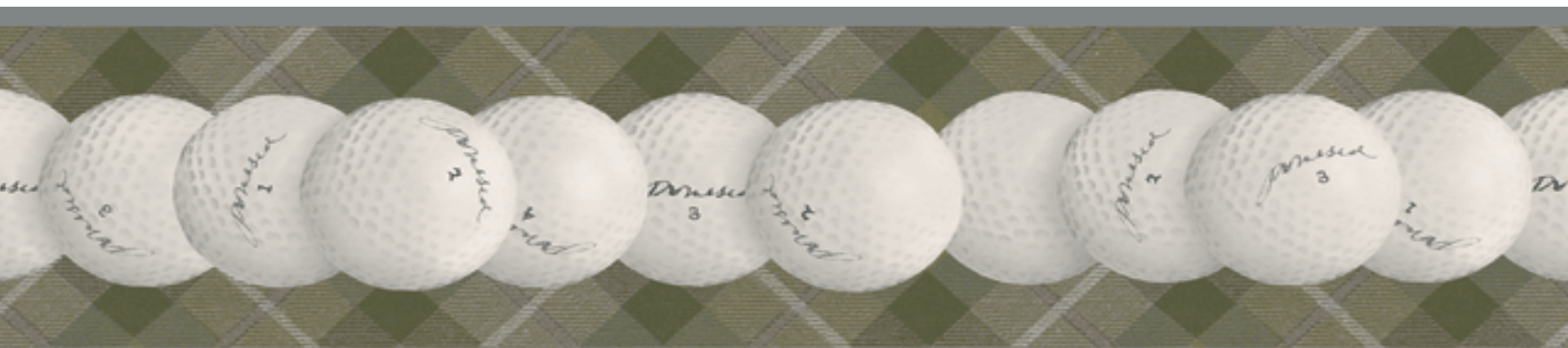
