Lausier served as the University Club's assistant golf professional during the 2017 season. While at the Tampa Palms Golf & Country Club, Lausier was named the North Florida Professional Golfers' Association 1995 Assistant Golf Professional of the Year. Lausier also worked as the head golf professional at both Bloomingdale Golfers Club, 1996-1999, and Golden Hills Golf & Turf Club, 1999-2005.

Most recently, Lausier spent 10 years teaching social studies and coaching basketball and golf at St. John Lutheran High School in Ocala, Fla. Under his guidance, many golf team members won tournaments at the state level and some went on to play college golf. Lausier's own daughter, Paige, was one of these golfers who earned an Ohio Valley Conference Championship while at Morehead State University and qualified to compete at the NCAA tournament in 2009.

Lausier has strong family ties and has been married to Traci, an elementary school teacher, for 29 years. Together they have two children, Paige and Teddy, and two grandchildren Noah and Eva.

“I believe members will find Teddy to be very approachable and a great administrator of our golf leagues and tournaments,” Christian said. “Teddy's approach to teaching is fun and non-intimidating; members looking to improve their game or just beginning will find him to be a very genuine and dedicated teacher.
