

Who can participate in Youth on Course?

The program is open to ANY child in Southern California who is a part of one of our 19 certifying junior golf organizations. Through our partnership with the NCGA Foundation, this program is available throughout the state.

How does it work?

After the junior has been certified, s/he will receive an SCGA Membership Card and a **Youth on Course** bag tag. The bag tag specifies whether the participant must have adult supervision to participate. When the youth shows up at a participating facility during the specified hours, s/he pays the **Youth on Course** rate and must sign the registration form. The golf facility tracks the number of range balls and green fees and submits the information to the SCGA Foundation monthly for reimbursement.

What courses are available?

A list of facilities along with the access times that they offer can be found at www.scgafoundation.org. Currently, there are over 65 participating courses in Southern California. The SCGA Foundation subsidizes the amount paid by the youth, so that the golf facility receives fair reimbursement for offering this access

What does it cost?

The only cost for a youth to participate is the fee at the course (generally \$1-\$5). Through the participant's junior golf organization, the SCGA Foundation will provide an SCGA Membership to every **Youth on Course** participant. SCGA Membership also includes an SCGA Handicap Index and a subscription to FORE Magazine.

How can I get more involved?

As this program grows, there are a number of ways to help. We are currently trying to add more golf facilities to the program, looking for additional organizations to participate, and always working on additional funding to expand the program. Please contact our office for more information.

The SCGA Foundation **Youth on Course** program makes the game affordable and accessible to ANY child by **establishing \$1-\$5 green fees and \$1 range fees at golf facilities'** during off-peak hours. The participants are certified by junior golf organizations for golf rules, etiquette, and ability, but also must be part of a life skills or educational program (such as The First Tee Life Skills Curriculum).
