Here are the big items (mainly just common sense and courtesy):

- Be prepared to arrive at your scheduled tee-off in time and warm up well before your tee time.
- Be sure to be patient and respect other players on the course as you wish to be respected. Keep your temper under control and conversations hushed while others are hitting their shots.
- Don't drive your cart or pull cart over tee off areas, greens or through sand bunker. Follow all signs on the course.
- Watch where you are walking on the green; stay off other players' lie.
- When your group finishes putting out on a hole, go to the next hole immediately. You can write your scores for the hole you just finished on the next hole.
- Don't be the slowest player. Keep up with the group in front of you. Observe the rules of Ready Play Golf.
- Repair the ground you play on and show care for the golf course.
- Turn off the cell phone and no text messaging during play.

### **CADDIES AVAILABLE**

As one of the preconditions they must complete 80 rounds of caddying within two years. They are employed by Parks and Recreation on minimum wage, so tip \$5-\$10 depending on how hard they had to work.

.... Situations Not Specifically Covered in the Rules

Q1: A player must mark their ball before lifting it to take relief from ground under repair, so as to accurately define the nearest point of relief. True or False?

Q2: When taking relief from an immovable obstruction in the rough (e.g. a sprinkler), a player may drop their ball on the fairway, providing it is within one club-length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole. True or False



Q3: Unless there is a Local Rule stating otherwise, when a ball hits an overhead power line that diverts it off its line of flight and sends it out of bounds, the player must return to where they played their last stroke from under penalty of stroke and distance,. True or False?

Q4: If a parent, who is following their child's round as a spectator, shouts out that they should play their ball where it lies on a path, as the nearest point of relief is in dense undergrowth, the player incurs a penalty. True or False?

Q5: A player may lean against a tree trunk to steady himself whilst playing a stroke. True or False?

Q6: A player may not use a golf cart in a stroke play competition that counts for handicapping purposes. True or False?

Q7: A player may draw a line around the circumference of their ball and then use this line to line up their ball with their intended line of play from a teeing ground. True or False?



Q8: Which of the following statements is correct? a) A marker may choose to ignore a breach of Rule by the fellow competitor whose card they are marking. b) A fellow competitor may always choose to ignore a breach of Rule by another player in their group. c) A player may ignore a breach of Rule by an opponent.


Q9: Which of the following statements is incorrect? a) Two competitors may share one caddie. b) A player may complete their round and then caddie for another player in the same competition. c) A player may be both a competitor and a caddie at the same time. d) A player may change their caddie during a round.

A1: False. A2: True. In the Rules of Golf 'rough' and 'fairway' are both included in the term, 'through the green'. A3: True. This is a true 'rub of the green', Rule 19-1. A4: False, the player cannot be penalised for something that is out of their control, but they should warn their parent that they could be penalised if advice is offered again. A5: True. A6: False. However, a Committee may introduce a Condition of Competition banning the use of golf carts. A7: True. A8: c) A player may ignore a breach of Rule by an opponent. Decisions 6-6a/5 and 33-7/9. A9: c) A player may be a competitor and caddie at the same time. It is not permitted; one reason is that a caddie is permitted to give advice to their player.
