

## 2019 Heron Lakes Men's Club Annual Report: Membership Information







- 19% of the Membership did not participate in a single Club event in 2019. This is lower than the previous two years (22%, 24%), but still an area for improvement.
- Club "mass emails" averaged an open rate of 66%, on-par with the percentage of Members actively participating in events (70%). Members are checking emails.
- Future plans to help boost participation: Welcome/Kick-Off event, increased promotion by the Course, possible loyalty program included with membership.



## 2019 Heron Lakes Men's Club Annual Report: Detailed Event Participation Data








- 10-year drop in Saturday tournament participation (new area courses opened, addition of Wednesday play, struggling economy, etc.); halted and reversed
- Saturday tournaments trending upwards, Wednesday tournaments becoming much more popular; Saturday weekly games dipping, but plans to revitalize



## 2019 Heron Lakes Men's Club Annual Report: Financial Summary







- 19% of Club Prize kick-ins went towards four season-long tournaments, three of which were new events (Eclectics & Civil WAOR) and three (Eclectics, Points Cup) required no additional entry fee as all members were automatically entered. 62 members received a prize(s) from season-long events 20% of membership.
- Sat/Sun Majors included three 2-Day events (Best-Ball Championship, Club Championship & Member-Guest) and Turkey Shoot, accounting for 7 days of play and the two biggest events of the year, hence the higher proportion of funds compared to Wed. Majors. New OGA event entries for Seniors/Super-Seniors.
