Acceptability of Scores

Fair handicapping depends upon full and accurate information regarding a player's potential scoring ability as reflected by a complete scoring record. Every player must be responsible for returning all acceptable scores. For handicap purposes Equitable Stroke Control must be applied to all scores, including tournament scores.

Adjusted gross scores from all courses with a USGA Course Rating and Slope Rating made during an active season, both at home and away, must be posted by the player along with the appropriate USGA Course Rating and Slope Rating.

Scores in both match play and stroke play must be posted for handicap purposes. This includes scores made in match play, in multi-ball, or in team competitions in which players have not completed one or more holes or in which players are requested to pick up when out of contention on a hole.

To post a 9-hole score, the player must play 7 to 12 holes, and at least 7 holes must be played under the Rules of Golf. To post an 18-hole score, the player must play at least 13 holes under the Rules of Golf.

By Laws Amendment Voting Results

Thank you to everyone that participated in our ByLaws Amendment voting. The Amendment passed 36 yes and 4 no which was met the required two thirds of votes placed. The board will begin

working on the Standing Rules to develop the processes and parameters should it ever become necessary to terminate a member.

True. Rules 2.2c and 17.1a. If any part of the ball touches a penalty area, it is treated as lying in the penalty area. This is true no matter which part of the course the rest of the ball lies in.
