Rules of Golf

Women's Club President, Robyn Pierce has asked that the newsletter include some reminders on the Rules of Golf. Golf rules can be complicated and have seen some major changes recently. An understanding of the rules can avoid conflicts with other players and insure a level playing field.

Unplayable lies

If your ball has come to rest in a position that you believe to be unplayable, such as under a bush, you always have the option of taking relief under the unplayable ball Rule. The player is the only person who can decide that their ball is unplayable. This can be done anywhere except in a penalty area.

If you decide your ball in unplayable, you have three options. Your first option is to go back to the spot of your previous play. The second option is to go back as far as you would like and drop on the line from the hole through the spot where your unplayable ball lies. Your third option is to drop the ball anywhere within two clublengths of where your ball lies, but no closer to the hole.

Each option incurs a one stroke penalty.

Seeking advice

While it is one of the most sociable of sports, golf is a solitary game. You cannot offer or give advice in competition.

For example, you cannot ask advice on club selection from anyone other than your team mate or a caddie. You should not offer advise such as slope of the green, to opponents in competition. However, you may ask for information on the Rules, distances or positions of hazards or the flagstick.
