#### **Course Index vs. Handicap Index**

An important responsibility for a player in Handicap Competition is to be certain that her correct handicap is shown on the scorecard. In order to fulfill that responsibility, you must know the difference between Handicap Index and Course Handicap.

Your <u>Handicap Index</u> is a calculation that represents a player's demonstrated ability and is rounded to the nearest tenth.

Your <u>Course Handicap</u> is a calculation used to determine the number of strokes you receive (or give) from a specific set of tees on any golf course.

When someone asks "What is your handicap?" you may respond "I'm a 22.9". That 22.9 is your Handicap Index.

Your <u>Handicap Index</u> must be converted to a <u>Course Handicap</u> and may be different depending on the golf course you are playing and from which set of tees. In this case, the <u>Handicap Index</u> of 22.9 becomes a <u>Course Handicap</u> of 24 on Heron Lakes Greenback from the Yellow Tees.

How do you convert your <u>Handicap Index</u> to a <u>Course Handicap</u>?

- The easiest way is to use the USGA GHIN app on your phone and go to the Handicap Calculator. (This app provides quick and easy score posting.)
- Use the World Handicap System Conversion Chart available in the Pro Shop of any golf course.

For several years, the HLWGC has raised funds for the Children's Course, a non-profit nine-hole par 3 course that serves as home of The First Tee Greater Portland. Their mission is to provide all children, including under privileged, low to moderate income, at-risk, and special needs youth the opportunity to participate in educational programs that build character, instill life-enhancing values, and promote healthy choices through the game of golf.

The First Tee uses the game of golf to teach Nine Core Values: Confidence, Courtesy, Judgement, Honesty, Integrity, Perseverance, Respect, Responsibility, and Sportsmanship. We are proud to support the future success of this remarkable program.

Last year we raised \$1,250 to have a paver installed at the course with our club's name on it! So this year I will be asking for monetary donations again in the form of a check made out to The Children's Course. I will be collecting donations on Tuesday's and Saturday's game days. All those that contribute will be awarded a ticket to be placed in a drawing to win a prize at the annual banquet at Colwood (there will be several.) Even if you cannot attend the banquet, the prize will get to you.

In addition, if you have any equipment that is no longer needed, I will be making arrangements with members who can collect on day's play and store items to be delivered at a later date. This continues to be a vital need for the program. Women's clubs are ideal as they are typically shorter and lighter for the children. Shoes, balls, carts, tees, etc. are all welcome.
