The next opportunity is for all members from Heron Lakes. We will begin our match play competition on June 1st. You will have about a month to play your first match. This is a great way to learn match play competition if you have not experienced it. Golfers will be organized in flights of 8 by handicap. The cost is \$5.00. Whatever your handicap is on May 15th will be used to place you in your flight and you will receive the same number of pops throughout the competition, no matter what happens to your handicap. Brush Up on the Rules

What is the "teeing area"?

- The teeing area is a rectangle where:
- The Front edge is the forward most point between the markers.
- The Side edges are the lines back from the outside edges of the markers.
- The Back edge is two club lengths back from the front edge.

What do I do if I take a stroke, strike the ball and it remains in the "teeing area"?

• You count that stroke. You can then lift and move the ball without penalty, and can play the ball from anywhere in the "teeing area" either from a tee or on the ground.

What if I take a stroke, strike the ball and it falls just forward of the front edge of the markers, but still on the tee mound?

You count that stroke, but you are no longer in the defined "teeing area". Play the ball as it lies.

What do I do when my ball is on a cart path?

- First, leave your ball where it lies. You will need to know where that spot is. Second, you do get free relief.
- You want to find the closest point of <u>complete</u> relief. Take the club you will use to make your next shot. Take your stance, placing that club head on the ground where the cart path no longer interferes with your stance or swing. Mark the point where the club head is touching the ground. This establishes one "reference point".
- Then go to the other side of the cart path and follow the same procedure. Measure from where your ball lies on the cart path to both "reference points" and play from the closer one. You get one club length from the nearest reference point or point of relief.
