Course Update

Bridge Update

The bridge deck was installed the last week of September. Due to the height of the bridge, significant work needs to be done to build up the ramps leading up to the bridge deck. Aerification Update

Due to an unavailability of trucking, the sand required for greens aerification will not arrive onsite until later in the first week of October. This has forced us to delay greens aerification until October 10th. We expect the course to be fully closed on October 10th and hope to have 9 holes open on October 11th. This schedule as always is weather dependent and is subject to change. Updates will be sent out via email by the golf shop staff.

Rules and Etiquette

Pace of Play

Nobody likes to stand around waiting for the group in front to clear the fairway or green. If you find that you are lagging behind the group in front, please make every effort to pickup the pace. There are several ways you can do this. For example:

- Do your housekeeping on your own time; start the round with tees, markers, balls and a ballmark repair tool in your pocket. Replace headcovers while you walk. Write down scores on the next tee. Don't make others wait.
- Play ready golf. Forget playing with "Honors".
 Whoever is ready to hit should play their shot.
- Keep your pre-shot routine short. Limit your routine to one practice swing or no practice swing.
- Once you are off the tee, think ahead. Determine your yardage and make your club selection before it is your turn to play.
- Be ready to play when it's your turn; take multiple clubs around the greens or when away from your cart.
- Read your putt prior to your turn; do not wait to finish tap-ins.
- If you're walking and are at the green, be sure to put your clubs where you will be exiting the green towards the next tee.
- If you are still behind, those who have finished the hole should go ahead and tee off while the rest of the group finishes putting.
