Cart path ONLY discount:

In May, we saw over 10" of rain. Fortunately, our course drains well and we usually do not have to stay cart path only for long. However, if we are cart path only, we are one of the only courses to actually give you a discount to play that day. You will save an additional \$5.00 off your regular rate, just for coming out and playing.

Remember, saving money is like making money. So next time it's just a little soggy, load up the clubs and still head out to the farm for a great round of golf.



Driving Range Technique

We are the only local driving range and one of the only places that does not upcharge golfers for hitting off grass. Many may ask yourself, why should you get charged more for hitting off grass? Our driving range facility takes more wear and tear than our entire golf course. Shot after shot is taken off the same piece of turf, and eventually, the tee is killed. We have worked diligently this spring to cultivate our top tee, so please take care of it when you golf.

Here is what our driving range looks like currently. Golfers randomly hit balls off any service and eventually kill all the grass. Here's the USGA's explanation: a scattered divot pattern removes the most amount of turf because a full divot is removed with every swing. Scattering divots results in the most turf loss and uses up the largest area of a tee stall. This forces the golf facility to rotate tee stalls more frequently, and often results in an inefficient use of the tee. A concentrated divot pattern removes all turf in a given area. While this approach does not nec-

essarily result in a full-sized divot removed with every swing, by creating a large void in the turf canopy there is little opportunity for timely turf recovery. So what can we do to better save the driving range? According to the USGA, the linear divot pattern involves placing each



shot directly behind the previous divot. In so doing, a linear pattern is created and only a small amount of turf is removed with each swing. This can usually be done for 15 to 20 shots before moving sideways to create a new line of divots. So long as a minimum of 4 inches of live turf is preserved between strips of divots, the turf will recover quickly. Because this divot pattern removes the least amount of turf and promotes quick recovery, it is the preferred method.



SEASON LONG SKINS COMPETITION AND CHAMPIONSHIP

The premise is simple. We want you to have fun and WIN A LOT OF MONEY in the process. Everybody loves hitting that special shot and winning "a skin" at the end of the day. If you don't know what a skin is, it is THE LOWEST score on any individual hole in a competition out of the entire field of players. If two people tie for lowest, there is NO skin. Skins can be won by individuals or teams.

ANY league, event, or group you play in at Meadows Farms GC this season that offers skins as part of the competition is eligible for this additional competition. When you pay for your skins just add in \$2 for "The Season Skins." If you win a skin that day, you earn 1 point. Any eagle you make on YOUR OWN BALL on a Par 4, 5, or 6 earns 2 points. A hole in one earns 5 points! A skin won in any Meadows Farms monthly tournament will earn double points!

Each week we will publish the skins winners and their cumulative point totals for the season. The competition will close on September 10. The Top 10 Skins points leaders will automatically qualify for The Skins Championship on September 16 at 4:00 pm. EVERYONE WHO QUALIFIES WINS \$\$\$. All ten people will tee off #1 together with the highest score being eliminated on each hole. Any ties for high score will be settled by a sudden death chip, pitch, putt, or bunker shot. On the 9th tee there will be just two players remaining for THE BIG PRIZE! Note: Any ties for #10th place at season end will go into a separate shootout at 3 pm on September 16th immediately preceding the Championship proper.

SCOTT'S CORNER

MEADOWS FARMS COURSE SUPERINTENDENT

Summer is coming! Sure does not seem like it with April showers in May to drown all the spring flowers that bloomed in February! Say that fast three times!

Greens are responding well to cultural activities performed this season with very pleasing results. In the next few weeks I plan on a very light topdressing to further enhance the quality of ball roll and a "venting" practice to allow a better air exchange later in June. You will see the holes but absolutely no disruption to the quality of ball roll. As you can see we sodded the bulkheads, the forward tee on the Warm Up Hole and #1 Waterfall tee and should be opening the tees very soon. I have been doing a lot of work to #2 Island upper tee and your Greens Staff respectfully ask you to refrain playing the tee until opened.

Answer to May's Challenge:

How long does it take to reset 28 (Not 27) pin positions?

Answer: Done correctly, a skilled pinsetter could do all the cups in 4.5 to 5 hours. This assumes no damage to the cups/greens that requires extra time. Breaking it down that equates to almost \$11,000 of labor annually! Add the cup shells, the cup cutter, the cup setter used to ensure all cups are at the same depth throughout the course, it adds up!

My grandmother, who fascinated me with her love of the game told me; "to always leave the course better than you found it"!

Never stick your putter in the cup. Never use the flag stick to pull the ball out of the cup. Use care to retrieve your ball as to not round the edges. You may have to play an emergency nine!

The USGA has made a lot of new rules in an effort to speed up the pace of pay. Check them out and let us know what you think

• A player will not receive a penalty if the ball (or ball marker) accidentally moves on the putting green or in search of a ball.

• Players can leave the flagstick in the hole while putting.

• Players may repair spike marks or other damage, including foot prints, on the green with no penalty.

• Players who have trouble in bunkers could get relief. If you want, you can remove your ball from a bunker (and place it in the fairway or rough behind the bunker, depending on where the bunker is) and accept a two-stroke penalty.

- Time searching for a lost ball would go from five minutes down to three.
- There's a proposal calling for players to take no more than 40 seconds to play their shot.





Did you ever wonder why your practice swing feels so comfortable while your shot that counts not so much? It's simply because during your practice swing you are not trying to hit the ball. . . You are swinging the club. Try it. . . a few times.

There is nothing in the golf literature anywhere suggesting club head speed away from the ball helps achieve additional distance, try slowing down your takeaway. Julius Boro's book "Swing Easy Hit Hard" It's a good place to start!!!

Note from Josh...

As many of you have experienced, we have been working diligently to keep the course in incredible condition. With that being said, we have had several golfers damage the course over the past few weeks. We do not believe they are members or regulars, but we need to try to stop them. While on the course, please act as a quasi-marshal, if you see someone doing something wrong, please call us at the proshop and we will address it immediately.

Here are some things we have noticed and are trying to address:

1) Please do not slam the flag stick back into the cup when putting it back in. If your aim is not perfect, you will end up gouging the edge of the cup and it will no longer be perfectly round.

2) If you miss your putt, please don't swing your putter and take it out on the greens. Each green costs approximately \$50,000 and the damage that occurs when a golfer takes a swipe out of one can last the entire season.



3) Please reach into the cup and pull your ball out, do not try to stick the head of your putter into the cup and try to jar it out. This damages the integrity and quality of the cup.

4) Each green receives approximately 70 ball marks per day at Meadows Farms, which is over 2,000 ball marks per month per green. You multiply that by the 28 holes we have; our grounds crew is responsible for repairing 60,000 ball marks per month. Please help us fix the ball marks. If they go unrepaired, it takes weeks for each one to heal. Please fix your ball mark and one other if you can.

5) Once you pass the no cart signs in the fairway and return back to the cart path, please keep all 4 tires on the path through the next tee box. Golfers like to pull off to the side of the path when they get close to the green and tee box, which creates a huge dead spot where we cannot grow grass.

6) If you take a large divot out of the fairway, fill it in with the sand bottles that are provided for you in the back of your golf cart. After you fill the hole with sand, please take your foot and try to level the sand out with the surface of the fairway. If the sand remains mounded, it provides difficulty for our mowers.

Thanks again for playing Meadows Farms Golf Course. We are on track to have one of the best seasons since the course opened. Again, if you see anyone destroying YOUR course, please let us know so we can address it immediately.
