PGA HEAD GOLF PROFESSIONAL NOTES CONT.

Although we've had a busy month, I'd like to concentrate on the details of an upcoming event, this year's Club Championship. The details of the event are below. Of special note, there will be no qualifier this year for the men's championship flight. The last two years only 17 players competed to fill the 16 spots available to play in the championship. We took two days of prime time weekend play to eliminate one player and with weekend tee times being at a premium, it has been decided to go back to straight seeded match play, which was the way things were done in the past at MCC.

The Championship flights for all divisions will be seeded up to the low sixteen handicap indexes with the Number 1 seed being the current Club Champions and will be played at scratch. Any player may sign up for the Championship flight and will be seeded in another flight if they are not one of the top 16 seeds. Seniors may sign up for more than one division. All other players will be

grouped into flights with indexes used as closely grouped as possible to form the other flights. The difference in handicaps in the handicapped flights is the primary factor in determining them, with the secondary factor being 16 in a group. This year you will set up your own matches within the time frames allowed for the match, so please give the phone number you can most easily be reach at when signing up. In each of the first two rounds, matches can be played anytime agreed upon within an almost two week period. This was done to allow for more people to be able to play despite any possible vacation schedules. Please note that any unplayed matches will be awarded to the player who shows up ready to play at 2pm on the final day of the scheduled round. There will be no extensions to the end dates of each round, so it is suggested that the match be played as early as possible. Once opponents in any given match are decided, they may immediately play the next match, there is no need to wait for a specific start date to a round. In other words, you may play your next round opponent even if the round start date has not yet happened. The senior men's division will be seeded by those 55 and older and will be flighted, by index, in as many flights as needed to accommodate those signing up, with the top 16 being in the Senior Champion flight. Again, all Championship flights will be played at scratch (i.e., no handicaps used in matches).

Handicapped Flight matches will be played at the official handicap on the day of the match. There is no official scorecard in match play so none will be made, check your and your opponent's official handicap before each match. Men's Championship matches will be from the Blue Tees, Regular men's handicapped flights from the Whites, Senior Championship from the White tees, Senior handicapped flights from the Gold tees. Women's Championship matches will be from the White tees, all other women's flights will be played from the red tees.

Sign up will be at the pro shop counter IN PERSON or by email to dhall@montgomerycc.com, no phone calls will be accepted to sign players up (Women's sign up is in ladies locker room OR email Dan). Matches will be posted in the handicap hallway for all matches, and if we can set up the new web site accordingly, online also. Matches may begin as soon as flights are determined and posted in the handicap computer hallway. Any match where the opponents have been determined may be played earlier than the stated starting date, but MUST be concluded on or before the last scheduled day of the round. There will be no extension to round end dates. Please check your personal schedules before signing up to make sure you have ample time to play in the allotted time frames and especially that you can play on the FINALS DATES; 7.30 am on Saturday, September 6, 2014, for all regular flights and Sunday, 8.00 am September 7, 2014, for all Senior Championships.








HANDICAP COMMITTEE MESSAGE:

Handicap Posting and Match Play

Overheard in the locker room, "When we play matches we don't keep a score, we just keep track of who wins each hole." Well maybe I shouldn't have, but I had to say something. "Whoa, friend" I exclaimed, "the USGA handicap rules require you to post scores from both match play and stroke play. That includes multi-ball and or team matches." (USGA Handicap System 5-1 c)

"Well, what if I pick up my ball because it won't matter in the match?" he quizzed. "If I finish out every hole even when it doesn't matter it'll just slow down the game. Is that what they want?"

"No" I replied. "If you pick up you record the score you would most likely make if you completed the hole. For example, you're lying 3 on the green and your partner is already in for 4 so you pick up. Now you need to determine the most likely number of putts you would take and add that to your 3. Be reasonable, if you're 25 feet from the hole you probably won't make the putt so you should record a 5 not a 4. If you're 2 feet away you probably will make the putt, record the 4."



"OK, but what if I hit 2 balls out of bounds on number 4? Is my most likely score an 8 or a 9?"

"Well neither really" I said as he looked at me confused. "There's a wrinkle, and it's called ESC. No it doesn't stand for that key on your computer that gets you out of trouble, it means 'Equitable Stroke Control'. ESC sets a maximum score you can post per hole based on your handicap. Your handicap is 18 right? So the highest score you can record for handicap purposes is a 7. There's a chart on the board above the computer that tells you your maximum. But remember, your handicap means your handicap on the course you're playing. You're an 18 here, but you may be a 20 at some other course and that would change your ESC maximum to 8."

"So if I make an 8 and my opponent makes a 9, we should score the hole as halved with 7s?"

"I didn't say you couldn't have a score more than 7. You can win the hole with your 8, but you would have to subtract one stroke when you post for handicap purposes."

"Now I'm late picking up my wife." I said. "We'll talk more about Equitable Stroke Control next month. Just remember, you have to post a score for every round you play."

Fair handicaps make the game enjoyable for everyone.

The 7th Women's Mid-Amateur Championship was played at Montgomery Country Club on June 5-6 with 36 competitors vying for the trophy.

Lisa Schlesinger of Norbeck Country Club added her third title of this championship to her long resume following wins in 2008 and 2009. She took the commanding lead on the first day by shooting 1 over par, leading the field by seven strokes. With the rain the night before, the mist in the air at the start, the deep rough and the fast greens, Andrea Kraus of Hayfields Country Club was the only other competitor shooting in the 70s the first day. Lisa followed her first round of 72 with a 77 on day two to capture the title by four strokes.

After the chill and wind of the first day, Friday was as glorious a golf day as you'd ever wish to be. Andrea Kraus, the defending champion, came in second shooting a 79 the first day and 74 the second day. The remaining gross winners were: Bonnie Fry in third (83-77), Jane Curtin in fourth (81-84), and Anita Venner in fifth (87-79) on a match of cards over Maggie Brady.

First low net winner was Katie Wille of Maryland G&CC with a score of 141. Katie birdied the fourth hole, 298 yard par 4 with a big lake near the green, both days. Oksun Kim of Turf Valley GC had a net of 146 for second place. The remaining net winners were: Jocelyn Lamond in third, Sandra Kim in fourth, and Sue Lee in fifth, all with a net score of 148.

This tournament will be held next year on June 2 and 3 at Lakewood Country Club, the site of the 1st tournament in 2008.



need to be sprayed. There is is always lots of hand watering going on as well so be on the lookout for the crew during these periods and I ask for a little patience if you encounter them on the course.

Besides all of the above we have been trying to get the bunker edges back to their original shape from when we cored them out, installed new drainage and replaced the sand five years ago.
