Greens Report by Superintendent Trevor Thorp

Despite the weather on April 4th, spring aerification went well. The greens were slower to recover than I was expecting. This was due to the cooler temperatures this April. Without sunshine and warmer nighttime temperatures, the soil temperature has been slow to rise. The bacteria in the soil, and in turn, the nutrient cycling to produce food for the plant, is highly dependent on the soil temperature.

I am trying out a new height of cut (HOC) on the greens this spring. We are mowing at 0.135 inch. This is up from our previous HOC of 0.125 inch. The goal of the higher HOC is to promote a healthier turf plant that needs less chemical inputs, saving money. If I am not happy with results of the new HOC by the first part of May, we will go back to our usual HOC.

A disturbing thing happens after aerification at every property where I have worked. People seem to forget how to fix their ball marks. I am always dumbfounded by this. The only reason I can think of is that people think it isn't important because the greens are all sandy. It is in fact the most crucial time to fix your ball marks. The plant is struggling to grow up through the sand and has already had a traumatic time with all that is involved during aerification. By not fixing the ball mark, the grass does not recover and we are left with a bare spot where we should have a nice fresh playing surface grown in. Please fix your ball mark, and fix any other marks that you see even if you did not make one.


