Joggers, Walkers & Site Seers!!

Fall foliage will be in bloom very soon. With it comes all the beauty that is a golf course! While we do appreciate our many joggers, walkers, dog walkers and site seer, we ask that they would use the community paths instead of the golf course cart paths.



Turf Talk

Hope all is well with everyone and the Golf Gods have been kind to you.

Last month I wrote about the winter work we will be performing. To expand and maybe be a bit more specific, the tree work will begin with our phase one approach. We will start on holes 1,9,10 and 18. The first phase will be to work into the tree line for +/- 15 feet with the brush cutters; cutting down to the ground to open up the floor. Phase two will involve select clearing of trees 2-3" caliper or less. Of course we will pay strict attention to the kind of tree, whether it has some ornamental value like a Redbud(spring color), Hickory or Maple(fall color) or it provides benefits as a food source for some of the wildlife existing in our area like Beech and Oak, but not limited to these mentioned. Once that phase is completed, we will then begin to raise the canopy of the trees so that golf balls that find their way into the woods may not only be found but also have the chance to be played back into play.

The advantage of performing this work will also allow for improved leaf management. The leaves will be blown just short of going into the treeline, mulched with our rough mowers, then be blown completely into the trees. If the leaves aren't mulched they can easily be blown back out into the fairways and roughs and off course continue to conceal an off target golf ball. In the next season we will work to keep these new areas weed and sapling free.

If all goes to plan we will then proceed to the par 3 holes, the cross over of the first landing are to the second landing area on hole 2, then moving on to widening the "tight" areas on 14,15 and 16.

Some of this work has already begun and we are getting back into the bunkers to make them more presentable and playable, in spite of the rocks.

At this time I would like to remind everyone about the marked white posts for entering and exiting the fairways. I think we've seen the improvement in the wear on the course that constant, repeated traffic inflicts. We move these posts weekly to spread out the wear and the effort works. Please do your part and remind others that don't do their part. We want to preserve and protect our golf course. Thank you and see you on the course!
