Happy 50th Birthday Lake Padden Golf Course!!! The course was completed and dedicated by the City of Bellingham on July 29, 1971.

Despite enormous COVID-19 challenges in 2020 - including a 40-day closure - Lake Padden Golf Course managed to have its best year since Premier Golf took over the course management in 2018. Just shy of 36,000 rounds were played. To add to that, Phil Gaggero and his team swept Premier Golf's (11 courses) 2020 awards ceremony via Zoom meeting in December. The awards were:

HANDICAPS:

With last years change to the World Handicap System just a few reminders :

- Handicaps will be based on 8 best scores of the last 20
- Maximum handicap allowed is now 54.0
- Handicaps will be revised on daily basis at Midnight
- Max score per hole for posting purposes for all players is a net double bogey (Par + 2 + any strokes per your handicap allowed on the hole).

The handicap policy for our Lake Padden Men's Club Tournaments has not changed. Players will receive a "boxed score" for any net score of 68 or lower in tournament play. Two boxed scores in a rolling 12 month period will result in a handicap modification in accordance with the policy. The boxed score figures for players are posted next to the computer. The handicap committee reserves the right to adjust handicaps in Men's Club events in order to protect the integrity of the game. Posting this year's scores started on March 1, 2021. Make sure to post all of your scores as soon as possible after you play, preferably no later than the same day you played. Play well and I look forward to seeing you on the course!

SUPERINTENDENT NEWS

The course is holding up well over the winter and greens are rolling good when we can get them mowed/rolled between the rain and freezing periods.

Tree work- We have met with officials from the city to start addressing our greens that have less sunlight. Namely holes 3,4,6,10,11,15,16. Steve J. from the city is working on a permit that will allow us to remove or limb some of the problem trees over a 5-year period. As for now, we are pruning the lower canopy on trees to the southeast of 15 and 16 greens. The pruning right of 16 green is also allowing us to use more of the tee surface on 12 tee to spread out the wear and tear from iron shots off the tee. It will get noisy when the time comes to chip the tree debris as we are not allowed to burn the debris but we will try and work around golf!

Tee boxes- The crew has spent some time reclaiming back tee box on hole 16 and the turf should be ready for opening this summer. Golfers playing in the tip and tuck tournament got a taste of this shot recently! We are in the planning stages of building new forward tee boxes on holes 6 and 7. Hole six would allow golfers who do not hit it as far to reach the green on their tee shot. Hole seven forward tee needs to be relocated to the right of the path to alleviate the current problem of trees obstructing the shot off the tee.

COVID restrictions- The restrictions on our golf course will be changed to the following:

- Golfers may now have the option to pull flagsticks while putting on the green. We opted to leave the risers at the base of the flagpole as it is
 easier to remove the ball after holing a putt and the turf edge around the cup has been holding up better. We have moved the risers at the
 base of the flag pole a half inch deeper to prevent balls from kicking back out when holed.
- We are awaiting the arrival of a new bunker rake machine since our old one is no longer usable. Once we again have the ability to stir/push the sand in the bunkers with the new machine, we will put out the hand rakes. At the current time, the sand is generally unworkable and it is not cost effective with reduced winter staffing to hand shovel sand that has been moved with each rain event.
- Ball washers will again be allowed on the golf course. Once temperatures remain above freezing for the season, we will put them out.
- Drinking fountains will remain out of use until a further ease of restrictions from COVID occurs.
